

MPUDC Reviews 134 Water Supply and Sewerage Projects; Focus on Timely Execution and Coordination



A one-day review meeting of the water supply and sewerage schemes of the Madhya Pradesh Urban Development Company (MPUDC) was held at the Sundarlal Patwa State Institute of Management in Bhauri. The meeting was chaired by the company's Additional Managing Director, Mr. Divyank Singh. During the meeting, a detailed review of a total of 134 completed and ongoing projects was conducted. Additional Managing Director Mr. Singh instructed project managers to promptly inform authorities about major issues arising during project implementation so that quick and effective solutions could be ensured. He also advised project managers to thoroughly study the contracts related to the schemes. He instructed contractors to generate and distribute water bills to consumers on time. He also emphasized accelerating the process of linking Water IDs with Property IDs.

Emphasizing teamwork, Divyank Singh said that the management unit, implementation unit, urban bodies, and contractors should work in coordination. He instructed contractors to ensure

adherence to the prescribed timelines. Mr. Singh also directed that the remaining road restoration work be completed on priority before the onset of rains. Necessary guidelines regarding the progress and quality of the projects were also issued during the meeting.

The Additional Managing Director stressed the need for detailed analysis of all projects. During the review meeting, discussions were also held regarding cases related to obtaining permissions and no-objection certificates from various departments including MPRDC, NHAI, the Water Resources Department, and MPRDA. A presentation on the physical and financial progress of the projects was given by Enc Mr. Anand Singh and Chief Engineer Mr. Shailendra Shukla. The meeting was coordinated by Deputy Project Director (Administration) Mr. Rajeev Ranjan Pandey. Project managers, assistant project managers, contractors, and expert consultants from all 10 PIUs participated in the meeting.

MPUDC Chief Engineer Shailendra Shukla Inspects Khurai STP Project, Reviews Progress and Quality



MPUDC Chief Engineer Shailendra Shukla inspected the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) located in Khurai under Sagar district. During the inspection, the quality and progress of the project works were found to be satisfactory. Chief Engineer Mr. Shukla gave necessary instructions to the team leader for the prompt resolution of pending approvals at the headquarters level. He also directed that coordination be established with the urban local body to expedite the work and ensure 100% completion of household connection work.

During the inspection, he also instructed the concerned officials and agency representatives to complete plantation and landscaping work as per targets within the stipulated timeline, ensure micro-planning of works, and complete quality restoration work. On this occasion, Assistant Project Officer Sanjay Pandey, Project Manager Sagar Dinesh Barele, APM, other concerned officials, and representatives of the contractor company were present.

It is noteworthy that rapid work is being carried out on the sewerage project in Khurai under the Integrated Development Project being implemented with the support of the Asian Development Bank.



IN THE SECOND FORTNIGHT OF MAY training on safety, health and skill development for workers was conducted in various urban local bodies

During the second fortnight of May, programs related to worker safety, health awareness, skill development, and environmental protection were organized in various municipal councils and project areas. The objective of these activities was to make workers aware of safe working systems, health protection, and work efficiency. In Jeron Khalsa and Kari Municipal Council, training related to workplace safety measures was organized, in which workers were informed about working safely and preventing accidents. Meanwhile, in Bhind, workers were provided training related to road safety and were also guided on stress management.

In Javar Municipal Council, workers were trained in meter reading and plumbing work to enhance their technical skills. Similarly, in Maihar, Mangawan, Sheopur, Sanchi, Rajnagar, Nemawar, and Khategaon, workers were given training on protection from heat, prevention of heat stroke, and health care. Additionally, health camps were



organized for workers in Katafod, Loharda, and Khategaon, where workers underwent health check-ups and received necessary medical consultation. To promote environmental conservation, tree plantation programs were organized in Susner, Makdaun, and Pankhedi, in which workers and local employees participated. All these activities were coordinated by the respective Community Development Officers.

Complaint Redressal Committee Meetings Held in Various Urban Local Bodies

In the second half of May, Complaint Redressal Committee meetings were organized in various urban local bodies. During the meetings held in Jatara, Barwah, Sihora, Barigarh, Karhi, Gohad, Panagar, Khajuraho, Makronia, Gormi, and Anjad, complaints and issues received from citizens and beneficiaries were reviewed, and necessary instructions were issued for their resolution. During the meetings, detailed discussions were held regarding the progress of projects, quality of work, and facilities being provided to the general public. Concerned officials were also instructed to ensure the prompt resolution of complaints and maintain coordination in the execution of works. In the same sequence, review meetings were held with the District Collectors in Narmadapuram,



Burhanpur, Khargone, and Mandla, where they were informed about the updated status of projects. Discussions were held on the implementation, progress, and future action plans of various schemes.

All the meetings were coordinated by the Community Development Officers of the respective areas
